- 1.5** BHEL reserves the right to reject any or all responses received against this EOI, at any stage, without assigning any reason, and to withhold, modify, extend, or withdraw this EOI process at its sole discretion.
- 1.6** Each Applicant shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its response, including any presentations or clarifications sought by BHEL. BHEL shall not be liable for any such costs regardless of the outcome of this EOI process.

Section 3 — About BHEL and Objective of this EOI

3.1 About BHEL

Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited (BHEL) (www.bhel.com), a Government of India Undertaking established in 1964, is an integrated power plant equipment manufacturer and one of India's largest engineering and manufacturing enterprises. BHEL's Regional Operations Division (ROD) undertakes business development, commercial contracting, and strategic alliances in the Power Transmission & Distribution sector, including MV/HV Switchgear (GIS and AIS).

3.2 Background — the DTL Tender

Delhi Transco Limited (DTL) has floated Tender No. T25P111924 for design, supply, erection, testing and commissioning of 33 kV Gas Insulated Switchgear (GIS) on a turnkey basis at five 220 kV substations — Indraprastha, Parkstreet, Wazirpur, Naraina and Okhla — with an estimated value of Rs. 303.78 Crore. The tender permits participation through a Joint Venture/Consortium structure, and prescribes four alternative routes (GIS Manufacturer, Collaborator, Subsidiary/Group, and EPC Contractor) by which the technical Qualifying Requirements may be met.

BHEL proposes to participate in this tender as the GIS manufacturer/technical partner (meeting the tender's Route-1 Qualifying Requirement), in Consortium with a Lead Partner who shall bring civil works, erection, and overall project execution capability, together with the requisite financial strength. BHEL's addressable interest is confined to the design, supply, and supervision of testing & commissioning of the 33 kV GIS equipment.

3.3 Objective of this EOI

This EOI invites responses from prospective Indian entities capable of, and interested in, jointly bidding with BHEL as the Lead Partner of a Consortium for the above tender — bringing civil works, erection, and site execution capability for EHV/HV substations, together with adequate financial strength to jointly undertake a multi-year Contract commitment. This is not part of the DTL bidding process; it is BHEL's own internal process to identify and select a suitable Consortium partner.

Section 4 — Nature of the Proposed Engagement

- 4.1** Proposed Consortium structure. The Consortium shall be an unincorporated, project-specific arrangement (as contemplated under the DTL tender's own Joint Venture/Consortium provisions), with BHEL bringing GIS design, supply, and erection, testing & commissioning supervision, and the Lead Partner bringing the balance civil works, erection, site management, and overall project execution of the GIS as well as remaining scope.
- 4.2** This EOI does not constitute Consortium formation. Selection of an Applicant through this EOI process shall result in a recommendation for formation of a Consortium; the Consortium itself, and the Consortium Agreement governing the parties' respective rights, obligations, and risk allocation, shall be separately negotiated and shall be subject to separate approval.
- 4.3** Conflict of interest / disclosure. An Applicant that is separately engaged, whether independently or as part of another consortium or grouping, in relation to the same or any other Package(s) of DTL Tender No. T25P111924, shall disclose the nature and extent of such engagement to BHEL at the time of submission of its EOI response. Non-disclosure of a material conflict shall render the response liable to rejection.

Section 5 — Eligibility (Minimum Qualifying Conditions)

The following are minimum eligibility conditions. An Applicant not meeting these conditions shall not be considered, irrespective of its score under the Evaluation Criteria at Section 6.

5.1 General Eligibility

5.1.1 The Applicant must be a company registered and incorporated in India under the Companies Act, 2013. Entities not registered and incorporated in India are not eligible to be considered, consistent with DTL Tender ITB Clause 1.2.1.

5.1.2 The Applicant, and each entity comprising an Applicant Group (see Para 5.4 below), must not be debarred or blacklisted by any Government Department, PSU, or Utility as on the date of submission of the EOI response.

5.1.3 Where the Applicant, or any entity with which the Applicant has a Specified Transfer of Technology arrangement, is from a country sharing a land border with India, the Applicant must hold valid registration with the competent authority (as prescribed under DTL Tender ITB Clause 1.2.3 / Ministry of Finance Order No. F.No.7/10/2021-PPD(1)), and shall submit documentary proof of such registration with its EOI response, failing which the response shall be liable to rejection.

5.2 Financial Eligibility

5.2.1 Positive Net Worth for the last 3 financial years.

5.2.2 Minimum Average Annual Turnover (MAAT), last 3 financial years, of at least Rs. 121.5 Crore (being 40% of the DTL tender's estimated cost, as prescribed for a Lead Partner under the tender's Joint Venture/Consortium provisions).

5.2.3 Liquid Assets of at least Rs. 20.25 Crore (being 25% of the corresponding tender benchmark), as on the latest audited balance sheet.

5.3 Restriction on Use of Related-Company Credentials

5.3.1 Where the Applicant is a subsidiary of a holding/parent company (including a foreign parent), the financial and technical credentials submitted in support of this EOI — including Net Worth, Turnover, Liquid Assets, and project execution experience — must be the Applicant's own, standalone credentials, excluding those of its holding/parent company. This restriction mirrors the corresponding provision in the DTL tender's own Qualifying Requirements (BDS Annexure-A), under which a subsidiary's technical experience and financial position must be evaluated exclusively on a standalone basis, excluding the holding/parent company, for any entity qualifying otherwise than through the tender's specific Route-2/3 Collaborator/Subsidiary mechanism (which is applicable only to GIS-manufacturing qualification and not to this EOI).

5.3.2 An Applicant relying, in whole or in part, on the credentials of a parent, holding, group, or sister-concern entity shall be treated as not meeting the eligibility conditions at Para 5.2 above, and its EOI response shall be liable to rejection on that ground alone, irrespective of its score under Section 6.

5.4 Multi-Entity EOI Responses (Applicant Groups)

Where an EOI response is submitted jointly by two or more entities proposing to together constitute the Lead Partner side of the Consortium (an "Applicant Group"), the following shall apply in addition to the conditions above:

- 5.4.a** Designation of Leader. The Applicant Group shall, at the time of EOI submission, clearly designate one of its constituent entities as the "Designated Leader" — being the entity proposed to assume the role of Lead Partner in the Consortium Agreement to be executed with BHEL.
- 5.4.b** Parameters to be met by the Designated Leader alone. The Designated Leader shall independently meet the requirements of, and shall alone be evaluated for, Evaluation Parameters 1,2,5,6 & 7 of the Evaluation Matrix. The credentials of the other constituent entities of the Applicant Group shall NOT be considered for the purpose of scoring these parameters.
- 5.4.c** Remaining parameters. For all Evaluation Parameters other than mentioned above, the credentials of any constituent entity of the Applicant Group may be considered, individually or in combination, in accordance with the scoring methodology prescribed for each such parameter.
- 5.4.d** Genuine participation required. Every constituent entity of the Applicant Group must have a defined, genuine role in the Consortium to be formed with BHEL for the DTL tender — whether by way of an identified scope of execution (e.g. civil works, erection, or other technical scope) or a financial commitment (e.g. as a co-obligor for the Contract Performance Guarantee, Advance Bank Guarantee, or other financial security, or by contributing to the Consortium's financial standing under the DTL tender's BDS Para 3.0). An entity whose role is confined to lending its credentials to this EOI response, without a corresponding execution or financial commitment in the Consortium itself, shall not be recognised as a constituent entity of the Applicant Group, and its credentials shall not be considered for any Evaluation Parameter.
- 5.4.e** Power of Attorney. The Designated Leader shall hold an irrevocable Power of Attorney, duly executed by all other constituent entities of the Applicant Group, authorising it to act, transact and bind the Applicant Group in all matters relating to this EOI, and thereafter to represent the Consortium in all dealings with BHEL. The Applicant shall submit the said Power of Attorney along with its EOI response.
- 5.4.f** Declaration of role. The Applicant Group shall specifically declare, at the time of EOI submission, the nature of each constituent entity's role in the Consortium to be formed with BHEL — namely, whether by way of execution commitment, financial commitment, or both — together with a brief description of the scope or commitment involved. Where a constituent entity is proposed to be admitted as an additional partner within the Consortium, it must independently satisfy the financial thresholds prescribed for a Consortium partner under the DTL tender's BDS Para 3.0. This declaration shall not be assumed by BHEL and must be affirmatively stated; any constituent entity for which no genuine execution or financial role is declared shall be disregarded under sub-para (d) above.

5.5 Indemnity Undertaking

- 5.5.1** Every Applicant shall confirm, without qualification or deviation, its willingness to furnish an Indemnity Bond in favour of BHEL, in the form prescribed by BHEL, at the time of formation of the Consortium (and not at EOI stage). Such confirmation shall be furnished in the format at Annexure-E to this EOI.
- 5.5.2** This confirmation is evaluated as a disqualifying gate under Evaluation Parameter 2 of the Evaluation Matrix (see Section 6 below). An Applicant that does not furnish this confirmation, or that furnishes it subject to any qualification or deviation, shall be treated as having failed this gate, irrespective of its aggregate score under the other Evaluation Parameters.

Section 6 — Evaluation Criteria

Applicants meeting the eligibility conditions at Section 5 shall be evaluated by the EVALUATION COMMITTEE against an 11-parameter scoring matrix ("Evaluation Matrix"), carrying a maximum of 42 marks, enclosed separately as Annexure A to this EOI.

- Two parameters function as disqualifying gates, in addition to carrying marks: Parameter 1 (debarment/blacklisting) and Parameter 2 (confirmation to furnish the Indemnity Bond at Consortium formation, per Section 5.5 and Annexure-E). Any adverse finding on Parameter 1, or failure to give unqualified confirmation on Parameter 2, shall render the EOI response ineligible, irrespective of aggregate score, subject to the EVALUATION COMMITTEE's examination of the facts. **Please note that there shall not be any change in the Indemnity form annexed with this EOI.**
- The EVALUATION COMMITTEE's evaluation and recommendation shall be placed before the Competent Authority for approval as per BHEL's applicable internal process. Recommendation by the EVALUATION COMMITTEE does not, by itself, constitute selection or approval.

Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited, a company incorporated under the Companies Act, having its Registered Office at BHEL House, Siri Fort, New Delhi-110049 (hereinafter referred to as “BHEL”, which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, include its successors, administrators and assigns).

WHEREAS BHEL and the Lead Partner have formed / are forming a Consortium to jointly bid for Delhi Transco Limited (DTL) Tender No. T25P111924 for Design, Supply, Erection, Testing and Commissioning of 33 kV Gas Insulated Switchgear (GIS) on a turnkey basis (hereinafter the “Tender”), with BHEL bringing GIS design, manufacture, supply and supervision of testing & commissioning, and the Lead Partner bringing civil works, erection, site execution and overall project management; and

WHEREAS under the Tender, the Consortium is jointly and severally liable to DTL for the entire scope of the Contract, the Contract Performance Guarantee is furnished in the Consortium's joint name, and a default in the Lead Partner's scope of work may expose BHEL to Liquidated Damages, forfeiture of the Contract Performance Guarantee, and other consequences under the Contract; and one of the conditions of BHEL agreeing to form the Consortium with the Lead Partner is that the Lead Partner shall furnish this Indemnity Bond in favour of BHEL.

NOW THIS INDEMNITY BOND WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:

1.0 The Lead Partner hereby irrevocably undertakes to fully indemnify and keep indemnified BHEL against any and all loss, cost, damage or liability of whatsoever nature which may arise or be suffered by BHEL due to any delay, default, breach or omission on the part of the Lead Partner (including its sub-contractors) in the performance of its scope of work under the Consortium and the Contract with DTL — namely supply of equipment & services beyond BHEL scope, civil works, erection, testing & commissioning and site execution — including, without limitation, Liquidated Damages levied by DTL under Clause 26.2 of the Conditions of Contract of the Tender, forfeiture or encashment of the Contract Performance Guarantee under Clause 13.3/42.2.1, any consequence to BHEL arising from the cross-default provisions under Clause 44.1/44.2, and Liquidated Damages for functional guarantee shortfall under Clause 28/28.5, to the extent the same are attributable to the Lead Partner.

- 2.0** The Lead Partner further undertakes to indemnify and hold harmless BHEL against any claim made by DTL against the Contractor under Clause 33.1 of the Conditions of Contract of the Tender, in respect of the death or injury of any person, or loss of or damage to any property, arising in connection with the supply and installation of the Facilities, to the extent such claim arises by reason of the negligence of the Lead Partner or its sub-contractors, or their employees, officers or agents, in the performance of the Lead Partner's scope of work.
- 3.0** Where any Equipment is handed over by DTL to the Contractor for the purpose of the erection portion of the Contract, and the Contractor is required to execute an Indemnity Bond in favour of DTL for the full value of such Equipment, the Lead Partner — being the party with physical custody of such Equipment during erection — hereby undertakes to indemnify and hold harmless BHEL, on the same terms and to the same extent as the Contractor's obligation to DTL, for the full value of any such Equipment lost, damaged, or misutilised while in the Lead Partner's custody.
- 4.0** Provided that the aggregate liability of the Lead Partner under this Bond in respect of Clauses 1.0 and 2.0 above, taken together, shall not exceed 100% (one hundred percent) of the value of the Package(s) forming the Consortium's scope under the Tender — being the same ceiling applicable to the Contractor's aggregate liability to DTL under Clause 30.1 of the Conditions of Contract.
- 5.0** This Indemnity Bond shall be valid till sixty (60) days after the later of (i) completion of the Defect Liability Period applicable to the Lead Partner's scope of work under the Contract (being 60 months in accordance with Clause 27.2 of the Tender, or such other period as may finally apply), and (ii) release of the Contract Performance Guarantee by DTL to the Consortium.
- 6.0** Where the Lead Partner comprises two or more entities constituting an Applicant Group, this Bond shall be executed jointly and severally by the Designated Leader and every other constituent entity that has declared a genuine execution or financial role in the Consortium, and BHEL's rights hereunder may be enforced against any one or more of them without the necessity of proceeding first against any other.
- 7.0** The condition of this Bond is that if the Lead Partner shall duly and punctually perform its scope of work and comply with the terms of the Contract to the satisfaction of BHEL, and no claim under this Bond arises, then this Bond shall be void; but otherwise it shall remain in full force. Within sixty (60) days of the date referred to in Clause 5.0 above, if BHEL assesses that no such claim survives, BHEL shall confirm the same to the Lead Partner in writing, discharging the Lead Partner from all liability hereunder. If any claim remains outstanding, BHEL shall notify the Lead Partner accordingly, and this Bond shall continue in force until such claim is resolved to BHEL's satisfaction, without prejudice to any other right or remedy available to BHEL under the Consortium Agreement or in law.
