Critical scaffoldings to be certified by the agency's scaffolding inspector by signing the scaffolding tag. Random checking of all other scaffoldings on sample basis will be done by the agency. Temporary platforms, walkways & fixtures used at site shall also be part of scaffolding, for which regular inspection shall be carried out and corrective measures suggested		
3.3.36	Guidance to agencies in designing and implementation of Lift Plan, imparting training, certification and guidance to riggers, rigging foreman, crane operators and signalman. 4.0 Terms & Conditions

4.1	Sub-letting of jobs within the agreed scope of work, in any manner is not permitted.	
4.2	All data/findings obtained from this work shall become the property of BHEL. This cannot be published/utilized by bidder/bidder's representative without written permission of competent authority of BHEL. Safety personnel shall keep all business and technical /safety information/procedures received from the other Party in connection with this Agreement confidential and treat it with the same degree of care as their own similar trade or business secrets and not make it available to third parties, unless permitted in writing by competent authority of BHEL-PSWR.	
4.3	Specialist shall be fully responsible for the tasks allotted to/ undertaken by them, authenticity of the reports/results etc. They shall prepare documents, witness/ undertake assessments and submit the documents/ reports to BHEL in time without hindrance of work.	
4.4	All the Credentials of Specialist provided by agency must be self-Scrutinized by the agency before submitting to BHEL. Same credentials shall be verified and approved by BHEL (if found in line with the qualification as mentioned above) PVUNL Patratu sites, 2X660 MW BHEL TALCHER sites and/or its customer prior to their deployment.	
4.5	Specialist shall interact with Contractors, customers/ consultants, erection agencies with regard to readiness of items to be inspected and other relevant HSE matters. They shall keep the Construction Manager/ Execution Engineer/ HSE official/ HSE Head (as the case may be) appraised of all such discussions/ interactions on daily basis.	

4.6	Reasonable office space with furniture for proper functioning of the Agency's Specialist will be provided by BHEL free of any charges. 4.7	BHEL shall provide furnished bachelor accommodation as available at respective sites free of charges the Specialist posted at construction sites, (Including Free electricity and water supply) and free transport facility on sharing basis at respective sites for attending duty at site. Company Transport will be provided only to the extent it is feasible in the circumstances of the site. Free Transport may be provided for going to hospital or buying medicines in emergency cases only on the recommendation of the Doctor and/or at discretion of the Construction Manager.	
4.8	The bidder shall arrange unlimited mobile phone facility, camera (if required) and sufficient nos. of Laptop/ Desktop (each Specialist should be having separate laptop/ desktop) with provision of internet, Printer(s) along with cartridge, stationary etc. for the use of their personnel at site, at their own cost. Bidder shall ensure that Specialist personnel deployed by it, has smart phones (with 4G internet connectivity) so that they can take photos/videos promptly and also communicate immediately as per requirement of BHEL.	
4.9	Bidder shall provide its safety personnel raincoat, gumboot, safety shoe, goggles, binocular, torchlight and enough other welfare support as they will be required to work at odd hours and face adverse climate at site. No additional payment will be made by BHEL on account of that.

The movement of Agency's Specialist outside the project site shall be subject to the prior approval of BHEL Construction Manager. 	
4.11	Agency shall make available suitable personnel/ senior level technical personnel (other than Specialist posted at site) for discussions/ interactions with BHEL, Customers/ Consultants, vendors/ sub-Contractors wherever need arises. Senior level personnel of Agency will visit the site periodically (at least once in 3 months Onsite) wherever their personnel are posted to ascertain the quality of jobs performed by their site personnel and for further betterment of jobs executed by them. Such visits of senior personnel of the Agency will be free of any additional charges to BHEL.	
4.12	Specialist shall follow working hours, number of working days per week, weekly off and holidays as per norms and holiday list of BHEL office where they are deployed.	
4.13	Each man day shall consist of 08 (eight hours) working hours excluding lunch break. However, working hours and timing shall be as per BHEL site practice must follow by Specialist. Work at site may continue round the clock including Sundays & holidays and Specialist shall have to be at site along with BHEL personnel subject to requirement, for which no extra payment will be made. No compensatory off/leave will be granted in case of such working on Sundays/ holidays/ extended hours. However, BHEL Sites shall ensure adequate breaks/ rest to Specialist over extended duty hours or on Sundays and holidays.

If any person is leaving site on resignation/ long leave (more than 10 days in one stretch), replacement shall be made within 15 working days otherwise a penalty of Rs. 1,000/- (Rupees one thousand only) per day starting from 1st day of absence, will be imposed.	
4.15	BHEL Sites may also follow Shift working to meet the requirements of construction activities, hence BHEL reserve the rights to depute Specialist during any shift in a day.

Contractor shall furnish duly signed and stamped copies of pay roll sheet as proof of disbursement of all payments to Specialist within one months of due date of Pay date.

No other compensation will be given by BHEL.

Agency need to furnish its acceptance / objection of performance evaluation within 7 days from the date of submission of said review. BHEL reserves the right to terminate the contract or demand for replacement, in case Specialist performance is not satisfactory in a quarter (i.e. if Average Weighted Score of 3 consecutive months is less than 2), without mentioning any specific reason. The travel expenses of such replacement Specialist shall be in the scope of agency.	
4.24	If due to negligence and/ or non-observance of safety and other precautions by Specialist, any accident/ injury occurs to any other person(s)/ public, the Agency shall bear compensation and other liabilities as decided by appropriate authority/ BHEL/ Customer.	
4.23	The Agency shall be responsible for medical expenses & life insurance for deployed Specialist. It shall be the sole responsibility of Agency to take insurance policies for the Specialist against risks of accidents and injury while at work and make compensation as per applicable rules and regulations prevalent in the area. Copy of insurance policy shall be submitted to BHEL before deployment.	
4.22	Quarterly meeting (Virtual) with agency shall be arrange by BHEL PSWR site/HQ.	
4.21	In case any Specialist found to indulge in malpractice/s, their services will be terminated with immediate effect without giving any notice. Also, in such cases, BHEL may impose penalty and/or impound the payment towards services rendered by such Specialist. Replacement of such persons will have to be arranged by the Agency within 15 days.	
4.20	In case the performance of any Specialist found to be unsatisfactory, his services shall be discontinued by BHEL and no payment shall be made against deployment of such unacceptable Specialist, from the date Specialist has been notified as unsatisfactory. 4.26.3	Bidder shall report to BHEL in writing any damages to equipment/components on receipt, storing, and during withdrawal of the materials from stores, in transit to site and unloading at place of work and during erection and commissioning till trial operation completion including handing over. The above report shall be as prescribed by BHEL site management. Any consequential loss arising out of non-compliance of this stipulation will be borne by bidder.

4.28	LIMITATION OF LIABILITY Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement or the Work Order or any other mutually agreed document between the parties, the maximum liability, for damages, of the Supplier, its servants or agents, shall under no circumstances exceed an amount equal to the Price of the Agreement or the Work Order. The bidder shall not in any case be liable for loss of profit or special, punitive, exemplary, indirect or consequential losses whatsoever.	

4.29	COMPLIANCE
4.29.1	Successful bidder shall ensure that its employees, servants, consultants and agents abide by all Applicable Law, relating to the performance of the Work and by all rules and regulations of those Governmental Authorities and persons who have control or jurisdiction over the Site (including the timely payment of any and all fees, assessments, or other governmental charges and registrations with relevant agencies or other Governmental Authorities required in connection therewith) and with the terms and conditions of any Authorizations.
4.29.2	Successful bidder represents that it is fully aware of all of the Applicable Laws, terms and conditions of the Authorizations, consents, business practices and plant rules and regulations which must be complied with when performing the Work.
4.29.3	Successful bidder shall furnish to the BHEL / Employer, promptly upon request, such information concerning its employees, consultants, servants and agents as BHEL / Employer may be required to furnish to any applicable Governmental Authorities.

Note: - In case, no response received from agency within due time for performance evaluation, the said performance review for the month shall be deemed as accepted by the agency.

TECHNICAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (TCC) Chapter – III: Time Schedule and Mobilisation

TIME SCHEDULE & MOBILIZATION

3.1. Contract Period

The period of contract is for 24 months from the date of letter of award. However, this contract may be extended as per site request on the same rates, terms & conditions and at the discretion of BHEL.

3.2. Mobilization

Agency must ensure mobilization of Specialist shall be within 30 days from the date of receipt of LOA along with detail of deployment (requirement) from BHEL. Following will be the mode for mobilization/ deployment of Specialist at site.

- 3.2.1. All Specialist requirement as mentioned in Chapter-II is tentative and mobilization of Specialist shall as per actual requirement at PVUNL Patratu site and at 2X660 MW BHEL TALCHER site. Mobilization shall start only after issuance of work order from BHEL PSWR HQ.
- 3.2.2. On receipt of work order (to agency) for Specialist deployment by Agency preferably shall submit document in support of credentials viz. Qualifications & experience of each Specialist to respective Site In-Charge of BHEL/ HSE officials with copy to Head (HSE)/ BHEL-PSWR Nagpur within 15 days. However, 30 days (from the date of W.O.) are provided to the agency for deployment of Specialist. No penalty is imposed in case of delay in submission of credential for deployment.
- 3.2.3. After submission of credential, the agency shall obtain acceptance/ approval from respective Site In-charge/ HSE Head/ HSE official at site. BHEL PSWR site HSE official shall issue acceptance/ approval to the agency. Then Agency shall deploy Specialist within 30 days from work order issuing date. In case agency failed deploy Specialist, for any reason what so ever, within 30 days from issue work order then penalty of Rs 1,000/- per man-day shall be applicable from 31st day of date of work order to the concern agency.
- 3.2.4. In case Agency failed to deploy Specialist due to unavoidable circumstances (i.e. COVID-19 or any other inevitable condition of Specialist) there shall be NO penalty imposed on agency. However, agency has to inform BHEL within the due deployment date along with the supporting documents.
- 3.2.5. In case Specialist go on long leave exceeding 10 days with the approval of site in charge/ HSE head at site, the Contractor will have to make suitable alternative arrangements for deployment of suitable personnel during the absenteeism. In case substitute Specialist is not deployed by the agencies within 15 days from the date of absenteeism of Specialist deployed at site, BHEL will impose penalty from 16th days onwards @ Rs. 1,000/- per manday. The travel expenses of such replacement Specialist shall be in the

scope of agency.

In case Specialist leave not approved by site in charge/ HSE head at site and/or Specialist leave the site without informing site in charge/ HSE head then it is treated as unauthorized absence at site. BHEL will impose penalty from 1st days onwards @ Rs. 1,000/- per man-day.

3.2.6. Penalty shall be deducted on pro-rata basis from the earliest monthly bill or Security deposit (SD) of agency or from any sites where agency is working.

Note: - The aforesaid penalty shall be limited to 05 % of executable contract value (i.e. Work Order value).

Terms of payment

- 4.1. Based on man months deployed and certification by Construction Manager for services at site, monthly payment will be made at respective sites within 30 days from the date of submission of complete RA bills subject to verification.
- 4.2. It shall be the responsibility of Agency to obtain and submit certificate from BHEL authority regarding deployment of Specialist (attendance statement).
- 43. Period between 1st days of the last month to last day of that month shall constitute one month.
- 4.4. The Agency shall preferably submit the monthly bills along with certification and Proof of Salary slips for all the Specialist deployed at site (as mentioned above) latest by 7th of succeeding month to respective BHEL-PSWR site office.
- 4.5. BHEL shall pay Salary & Wages portion or salary at actual, based on salary slip limited to quoted L1 salary portion. Other charges (i.e. Establishment & administration expenses of site, Overheads, Profit etc. if any) shall be paid as per L1 quoted price.
- 4.6. Deductions, if any, shall be made by BHEL from the monthly bill and payment shall be made within 30 days by respective BHEL site subject to correctness and completeness of the bill.
- 4.7. The RA bill payment shall be made as per Cl. No. 10.0 of Chapter –X of SCC (part of Volume I-BCD) and cl no 2.23 of GCC (part of Volume I-BCD). However, Clause no.10.3 & 10.4 of Chapter –X of SCC shall not be applicable.
- 48. However, schedule of regular disbursement of payment to Specialist shall be ensured by agency irrespective of release of payment from BHEL & no delay in disbursement of salary to Specialist on this ground shall be acceptable.
- 4.9. This contract shall be executed at BHEL site level & all issues related with site shall be resolved at project site/ BHEL PSWR HQ.
- 4.10. Work order issued to agency from BHEL PSWR HQ, either overlapping to each other or continuation, shall be consider as a single work order and the last RA Bill/ Invoice of such work order as confirm by PSWR HQ shall be treated as Final Bill for each project site.

Note:

1. Retention Money & Performance Guarantee as per General Conditions of Contract shall not be applicable.

TECHNICAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (TCC) Chapter – IV: Terms of Payment

- 2. Following are the Document shall be submitted along with RA Bill.
 - a. Joining Format/ details of Specialist (as applicable).
 - b. Absentee's statement.
 - c. Any other statutory document (If any).
- 3. Payment shall be made based on actual deployment of Specialist at sites (after deduction of penalty in case of non-deployment).

TAXES, DUTIES, LEVIES (Rev 14 dated 09/10/2020)

- 1. All taxes excluding GST, GST Cess & BOCW Cess but including, Royalties, fees, license, deposits, commission, any State or Central Levy and other charges whatsoever, if any, shall be borne by you and shall not be payable extra.
- 2. Any increase of the taxes excluding GST, GST Cess & BOCW **Cess**, at any stage during execution including extension of the contract shall have to be borne by the contractor. Quoted/accepted rates/ price shall be inclusive of all such requirements. Please note that since GST on output will be paid by BHEL separately as enumerated below, your quoted rates/ price should be after considering the Input Credit under GST law at your end.

3. **GST**:

The successful bidder shall furnish proof of GST registration .GST along with Cess (as applicable) legally leviable & payable by the successful bidder as per GST Law, shall be paid by BHEL. Hence Bidder shall not include GST along with Cess (as applicable) in their quoted price.

- 4. GST charged in the Tax Invoice/Debit note by the contractor shall be released separately to the contractor only after contractor files the outward supply details in GSTR-1 on GSTN portal and input tax credit of such invoice is matched with corresponding details of outward supply of the contractor and has paid the GST at the time of filing the monthly return
- 5. E-invoicing under GST has been implemented with effect from 1st October 2020 for all the taxable persons having turnover more than the threshold limit in any preceding financial year from 2017-18 onwards. Therefore, for all the taxable persons falling under the purview of E-invoice, it is mandatory to mention a valid unique Invoice Reference No. (IRN) and QR code as generated from E-Invoicing portal of the Government for the purpose of issuing a valid Tax Invoice. Only an E-invoice issued in the manner prescribed under rule 48(4) of CGST Rules shall be treated as valid invoice for reimbursement of GST amount.
 - If the successful Bidder is not falling under the purview of E-Invoicing then he has to submit a declaration in that respect along with relevant financial statements.
- 6. Bidder shall note that the GST Tax Invoice complying with GST Invoice Rules (Section 31 of GST Act & Rules referred there under) wherein the 'Bill To' details will as below:

- 7. Bidder to immediately intimate on the day of removal of Goods (in case of any supply of goods) to BHEL along with all relevant details and a scanned copy of Tax Invoice to below email ids to enable BHEL to meet its GST related compliances:-
 - Email id ---- to be intimated later on.
 - In case of delay in submission of the abovementioned documents on the date of dispatch, BHEL may incur penalty /interest for not adhering to Invoicing Rules under GST Law. The same will be liable to be recovered from the successful bidder, if such delay is not attributable to BHEL.
- 8. In case of raising any Supplementary Tax Invoice (Debit / Credit Note) Bidder shall issue the same containing all the details as referred to in Section 34 read with Rule 53.
- 9. Bidder shall note that in case GST credit is delayed/ denied to BHEL due to delayed / non receipt of goods and /or tax invoice or expiry of the timeline prescribed in GST Law for availing such ITC, or any other reasons not attributable to BHEL, GST amount shall be recoverable from the vendor along with interest levied / leviable on BHEL, as the case may be.
- 10. Bidder shall upload the Invoices raised on BHEL in GSTR-1 within the prescribed time as given in the GST Act. Bidder shall note that in case of delay in declaring such invoice in your return and GST credit availed by BHEL is denied or reversed subsequently as per GST Law, GST amount paid by BHEL towards such ITC reversal as per GST law shall be recoverable from the bidder along with interest levied / leviable on BHEL.
- 11. Way Bill: Successful Bidder to arrange for way bill / e-waybill for any transfer of goods for the execution of the contract.
 - The Bidder has to make their own arrangement at their cost for completing the formalities, if required, with Issuing Authorities, for bringing materials, plants & machinery at site for execution of the works under this contract, Road Permit/ Way Bill, if required, shall be arranged by the contractor and BHEL will not supply any Road Permit/ Way Bill for this purpose.
- 12. **New taxes and duties**:-Any New taxes & duties, if imposed subsequent to due date of offer submission as per NIT & TCN, by statutory authority during contract period including extension, if the same is not attributable to you, shall be reimbursed by BHEL on production of relevant supporting document to the satisfaction of BHEL. However, you shall obtain prior approval from BHEL before depositing new taxes and duties.
 - Benefits and/or abolition of all existing taxes must be passed on to BHEL against new Taxes, if any, proposed to be introduced at a later date.

In case any new tax/levy/duty etc. becomes applicable after the date of bidder's offer but before opening of the price bid, the bidder must convey its impact on his price duly substantiated by documentary evidence in support of the same before opening of the price bids. Claim for any such impact after opening the price bid will not be considered by BHEL for reimbursement of tax or reassessment of offer.

- 13. For transportation work, bidder shall declare in his quotation whether he is registered under GST, if yes, whether he intends to claim GST on forward charge basis. In absence of this declaration, BHEL will proceed further with the assumption that bidder intends not to claim GST on forward charge basis. However, in case of GST registered transporter, the amount to the extent of goods and service tax will be retained till BHEL avails the credit of GST. Further, transporter shall issue tax invoice which inter alia includes gross weight of the consignment, name of the consigner and the consignee, registration number of vehicle in which the goods are transported, details of goods transported, details of place of origin and destination, GSTIN of the person liable for paying tax whether as consigner, consignee or goods transport agency, and also containing other information as mentioned under rule 46.
- 14. TDS under Income Tax shall be deducted at prevailing rates on gross invoice value from the running bills unless exemption certificate from the appropriate authority/ authorities is furnished.
- 15. TDS under GST shall be deducted at prevailing rates on applicable value from the running bills.
- 16. TCS under Income Tax 1961 has been implemented with effect from 1st October 2020 for every seller having turnover more than threshold limit during financial year immediately preceding financial year in which the sale of goods is carried out, who receives any amount as consideration for sale of any goods of the value or aggregate of such value exceeding threshold limit other than export of goods or who is already covered under other provision of section 206C, collect from the buyer, TCS as per applicable rates of the sale consideration exceeding threshold limit subject to following conditions
 - i. Buyer shall be as per clause (a) of section 206C- (1H)
 - ii. Seller shall be as per clause (b) of section 206C- (1H)
 - iii. No TCS is to be collected, if the seller is liable to collect TCS under other provision of section 206C or the buyer is liable to deduct TDS under any provision of the Act and has deducted such amount.

If Successful Bidder is falling under the purview of TCS then he has to submit a declaration in that respect along with relevant financial statements before the start of work or if bidder is falling under preview of TCS during the work in progress then bidder is compulsorily required to submit relevant financial statement in the beginning of the respective FY.

For TCS claim, vendor has to submit relevant documents required as per Income Tax Act.

ANNEXURE-2

BOCW Act & Cess Act

Bidder may please note that the sub-contractor/bidder of BHEL engaging building or construction worker in connection with building or other construction work, are required to follow the procedures enumerated below:

- 1. It shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to ensure compliance of all the statutory obligations under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder.
- 2. It shall be sole responsibility of the contractor engaging Building Workers in connection with the building or other construction works in the capacity of employer to apply and obtain registration certificate specifying the scope of work under the relevant provisions of the Building and Other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 from the appropriate Authorities.

- 3. It shall be responsibility of the contractor to furnish a copy of such Registration Certificate within a period of one month from the date of commencement of Work.
- 4. It is responsibility of the contractor to register under the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and deposit the required Cess for the purposes of the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 at such rate as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, from time to time specify. However, before registering and deposit of Cess under the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996, the contractor will seek written prior approval from the Construction Manager.
- 5. It shall be sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to get registered every Building Worker, who is between the age of 18 to 60 years of age and who has been engaged in any building or other construction work for not less than ninety days during the preceding twelve months as Beneficiary under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996.
- 6. It shall be sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to maintain all the registers, records, notices and submit returns under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder.
- 7. It shall be sole responsibility of the contractor as employer to provide notice of poisoning or occupation notifiable diseases, to report of accident and dangerous occurrences to the concerned authorities under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder and to make payment of all statutory payments & compensation under the Employees' Compensation Act, 1923.
- 8. It shall be the responsibility of the sub-contractor as employer to make payment/deposit of applicable cess amount on the extent of work involving building or construction workers engaged by the sub-contractor within a period of one month from the receipt of payment. It shall also be responsibility of the Contractor to furnish BHEL on monthly basis, Receipts/ Challans towards Deposit of the Cess under the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder along with following statistics:
 - (i) Number of Building Workers employed during preceding one month.
 - (ii) Number of Building workers registered as Beneficiary during preceding one month.
 - (iii)Disbursement of Wages made to the Building Workers for preceding wage month.
 - (iv) Remittance of Contribution of Beneficiaries made during the preceding month
- 9. BHEL shall reimburse the contractor the Cess amount deposited for the purposes of the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions

- of Service) Act, 1996 under the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder. However, BHEL shall not reimburse the Fee paid towards the registration of establishment, fees paid towards registration of Beneficiaries and Contribution of Beneficiaries remitted.
- 10. It shall be responsibility of the Building Worker engaged by the Contractor and registered as a beneficiary under the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 to contribute to the Fund at such rate per mensem as may be specified by the State government by notification in the Official Gazette. Where such beneficiary authorizes the contractor being his employer to deduct his contribution from his monthly wages and to remit the same, the contractor shall remit such contribution to the Building and other construction Workers' Welfare Board in such manner as may be directed by the Board, within the fifteen days from such deduction.
- 11. Bidders may please note that though the quoted price is exclusive of BOCW (which will be reimbursed by BHEL as per sub-clause 9 above), however, If at any point of time during the contract period, non-compliance of the provisions of the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder is observed, BHEL reserves the right to deduct the applicable cess (1%) on the contract value and penalty (if any, imposed by Cess Authorities) from the payables on account of non-compliance.
- 12. The contractor shall declare to undertake any liability or claim arising out of employment of building workers and shall indemnify BHEL from all consequences / liabilities / penalties in case of non-compliance of the provisions of the Building and other Construction Workers' (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Act, 1996 and the Building and other Construction Workers' Welfare Cess Act, 1996 and the rules made thereunder.
