I. Pre-Qualification Criteria (PQR)

A <u>Technical</u>

The Bidders should have executed following in the last 5 years ending on the 'latest date of Bid Submission' of Tender.:

Executed minimum 1 No RESIN based Demineralization (DM) Plant or Condensate Polishing Unit (CPU) system in a power / industrial / infrastructure project.

B <u>Financial Turnover</u>

Bidders must have achieved an average annual financial turnover (Audited) of **Rs. 46 Lakhs** or more, over the last three Financial Years (FY) i.e. '2016-2017, 2017-2018, 2018-2019'.

Explanatory Notes for PQR

- i. The word 'EXECUTED' means achievement of successful commissioning of RESIN based SAC, SBA, MB vessels and operation of DM or CPU system for 1 full cycle of system operation, through PLC. Bidder shall submit the relevant documents against the above PQRs inclusive of Purchase order (wherein PO no., date, etc. is legible) along with proof of execution of said job(i.e. Completion Certificate/ commissioning report /or any other supporting document etc.) in the respective attachments in their offer in support of PQR.
- ii. Bidder to submit Audited Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Account for the respective years as indicated against Financial Turnover QR above along with all annexures
- iii. Bidder may arrange site visit in order to familiarize themselves with existing condition of site before submitting the bid in order to make their offer complete.
- 2. Major System has been erected in mechanical part and electrical part cable termination, testing and C&I part all work including PLC commissioning is balance. Agency to consider all rotary part grouting and alignment work as well as general servicing, cleaning, OIL replacement, motor greasing is to be done. All drives/ MOTOR were erected and meagre/IR test etc is to be considered. Any Motor repair/replacement is in agency part of work.
- 3. All balance supply is to be arranged as per approved datasheet and after MDCC from BHEL. Supply BBU with AQUADESIGN. Material received and balance for supply is enclosed. BBU List is just for information and Any NON BBU item like pipes, fittings, fasteners, lugs, glands shall be in agency scope. After award of work agency to check all material and submit report about same along with BBU proposal for SUPPLY as well as for E&C payments.
- 4. BBU items received are assumed to be available and healthy in condition. Any missing parts in received BBU items shall be in BHEL scope and any defective parts servicing and making it healthiness shall be in agency scope.

Shortages in piping material, fittings consumables supply for balance work shall be in agency scope. Cleaning, flushing, and making leak-proof of all piping work (erected earlier and any new erection) shall be part of balance work.
- 7. All instruments erection is balance and to be erected with calibration if applicable. Agency to consider handling, erection and commissioning assistance for all analyzer for which they have to engage OEM as per requirement. Any chemical reagent shall be part of agency scope.

- 9. As a part of commissioning work, agency to considerer all miscellaneous activities like arresting leakages in existing system from flange joints or welding joints. All Filter cleaning is part of agency work. - 16. Liquidated Damages/Penalty:
